

Submitting a Letter to the Editor by Publication.

Below you will find a “how to” submit letters to the editor by publication. Depending on the word count of the letter

- **Tri-City News**
 - Email Submission - limit to 300 words
 - In the email include Name, Address, Phone Number for verification purposes. They will not post phone or address information when published.
 - Email to news@trinews.com

- **The Jersey Shore Online**
 - Email Submission limit - submission to 500 words.
 - In the email include Name, Address, Phone Number for verification purposes. They will not post phone or address information when published.
 - Email to news@jerseyshoreonline.com

- **Asbury Park Press**
 - Email submission - limit to 250
 - In the email include Name, Address, Phone Number for verification purposes. They will not post phone or address information when published.
 - Email letters to yourviews@app.com

- **Coast Star**
 - Online submission - limit to 500 words
 - Submit online via starnewsgroup.com/submit-letter/
 - Must include first, last name, email address, phone number, and address
 - Copy and paste letter as written
 - Press the submit button lower underneath the “letter to the editor text”

- **The Coaster**
 - Email submission - limit 250 words.
 - In an email write your first and last name, location, and phone number.
 - Email copy to editor@thecoaster.net

- **Two River Times**
 - Submitted via email - limit 300 words
 - In the body of your email include: Name, address, phone number and email address of the writer (phone numbers and addresses will not be published but are required to confirm the identity of the letter writer) ○
Email copy and paste ad email to editor@tworivertimes.com

- **Monmouth Journal**
 - Email publication - Maximum 500 Words or 1000 characters
 - In the body of your email include: Name, address, phone number and email address of the writer (phone numbers and addresses will not be published but are required to confirm the identity of the letter writer)
 - News@MonmouthJournal.com

- **Tapinto [Colts Neck/Redbank/Long Branch](#)**
 - Online submission - limit to 500 words or less.
 - Create a profile on either of the above linked websites.
 - Click on Submit content.
 - Click on “Letter to the editor” on the submit content tab ■ The headline will be given in advance.
 - Enter name (First/Last)
 - Phone number
 - Town of Residence
 - Copy and paste letter given
 - Will give an image beforehand

 - Online submission - limit to under 500 words ○ Create a profile based on location
 - After creating an account please proceed to your email to verify your account.

I am writing to express my grave concern over the recent legal action taken by New Jersey's Attorney General against Monmouth County school districts to prevent parental notification about discussions concerning their children's sexual identity in school.

As a supporter of parental involvement in education, parents must have a central role in shaping their children's well-being and future.
